No.12/03/2018-4HG1/1170685/1) Whereas it appears to the Governor of Punjab that to meet the challenge of rapid growth of Hariana Town of District Hoshiarpur and to provide for a workable frame work for its comprehensive planned and regulated development, the preparation of Statutory Master Plan of Hariana Town is very essential. Hence in order to develop Hariana Town and its surroundings in an orderly manner and to prepare its master plan under "The Punjab Regional and Town Planning and Development Act, 1995", the Governor of Punjab is pleased to declare the Local Planning area of Hariana Town within the meaning of sub section (1) of section 56 of "The Punjab Regional and Town Planning and Development Act, 1995". The total area proposed for Local Planning Area Hariana Town is 43567 Hectares (107610 Acres) including Hariana Town and adjoining 127 villages. The schedule of boundary of Local Planning Area, Hariana is as under:-

SCHEDULE OF BOUNDARY

North: Starting from point 'A' which is the common meeting point of village Dherian (H.B.No.471), village Thana (H.B.No.467) of L.P.A. Garhdiwala and village Dharampur (H.B.No.586) of L.P.A. fatwara moving towards East along state boundary of Himachal Pradesh and Northern boundaries of village Dherian (H.B.No.471), village Kukanet (H.B.No.472), village Bari Khad (H.B.No.473), village Bhera (H.B.No.474), village Korat (H.B.No.480), village Patial (H.B.No.481), crossing the Nangal Jarial-Hoshiarpur road and again moving towards East along the northern boundaries of village Patial (H.B.No.481), village Malot (H.B.No.486), village Mehngarwal (H.B.No.488), village Nari (H.B. No. 492), village Sieran (H.B.No.495), crossing Dharamsala- Hoshiarpur road (NH-03), then again moving towards East along the northern boundary of village Sieran (H.B.No.495), up to point 'B' which is the common point of village Sieran (H.B.No.495), village Dada (H.B.No.496) of L.P.A. Mahilpur and state boundary of Himachal Pradesh.

East: Thence from point 'B' moving towards south along the Eastern boundary of village Sieran (H.B.No.495), village Sherpur Bahtian (H.B.No.367), then moving towards West along Southern boundaries of village Sherpur Bahtian (H.B.No.367), village Thathal (H.B.No.368), then moving towards South along the Eastern boundary of village Adamwal (H.B.No. 370),

crossing Dharamsala -- Hoshiarpur road (NH-03), then again moving towards West

along the Southern boundary of village Adamwal (H.B.No. 370), then moving towards South along the Eastern boundary of village Bassi Ballo (H.B.No.376), crossing Hajipur -- Hoshiarpur (Kandi Canal road) and Kandi Canal then again moving towards South along the Eastern boundary village Bassi Ballo (H.B.No.376), then moving towards West along the Southern boundary of village Bassi Ballo (H.B.No.376), crossing the Nangal Jarial- Hoshiarpur road, then again moving towards West along the Southern boundaries of village Bassi Ballo (H.B.No.376), village Bassi Maruf Siala (H.B.No.381), then again moving towards South along the Eastern boundary of village Bagpur (H.B.No.382), crossing the Dasua -- Hoshiarpur road (SH-24), then again moving towards South along the Eastern boundaries of village Bagpur (H.B.No.382), village Sataur (H.B.No.178), then again moving towards East along the Northern boundary of village Sajjan (H.B.No.181), then again moving towards South along the Eastern boundary of village Sajjan (H.B.No.181) up to point 'C' which is the common meeting point of village Sajjan (H.B.No.181), village Brahmjit (H.B.No.373) of L.P.A. Hoshiarpur and village Hardo Khanpur (H.B.No.224) of L.P.A. Sham Chaurasi.

South:

Thence from point 'C' moving towards West along the Southern boundaries of village Sajjan (H.B.No.181), village Charial (H.B.No.182), village Bains Khurd (H.B.No.177), moving towards West along the Southern boundaries of village Bains Khurd (H.B.No.177), village Gobindpur Khun Khun (H.B.No.141), village Bhakal (H.B.No.150), village Kotla Naudh Singh (H.B.No.143), then moving towards South along the Eastern boundary of village Hussainpur Guru (H.B.No.138), crossing Sham Chaurasi- Haryana road then again moving towards South along the Eastern boundary of village Hussainpur Guru (H.B.No.138), then again moving towards West along the Southern boundaries of village Hussainpur Guru (H.B.No.138), village Berun Kangri (H.B.No.81), village Tajpur Kalan (H.B.No.75), village Bariana (H.B.No.68), crossing Bullowal - Haryana road, then moving towards West along the Southern boundaries of village Bariana (H.B.No.68), village Nangal Isher (H.B.No.69), village Nadali (H.B.No.517), village Hazipur (H.B.No.515), village Jallowal (H.B.No.57), village Chak Khelan (H.B.No.509), up to point 'D' which is the common point of village Chak Khelan (H.B.No.509), village Dhurian (H.B.No.56) of L.P.A. Sham Chaurasi and village Darapur (H.B.No.52) of L.P.A. Garhdiwala.

West :

Thence from point 'D' moving towards North along the Western boundaries of village Chak Khelan (H.B.No.509), village Sotla (H.B.No.525), village Dhut Kalan (H.B.No.522), village Pandori (H.B.No.524), crossing the Dasua -Hoshiarpur road (SH-24), then again moving towards North along the Western boundaries of village Pandori (H.B.No.524), village Daulatpur (H.B.No.510), village Gajj (H.B.No.430), moving towards West along the Southern boundaries of village Tentpal (H.B.No.434), village Nangal Thathal (H.B.No.436), village Nangal Ghorewaha (H.B.No.437), then again moving towards North along the Western boundary of village Nangal Ghorewaha (H.B.No.437), crossing Kandi Canal and Hajipur - Hoshiarpur (Kandi Canal road), then again moving towards North along the Western boundaries of village Nangal Ghorewaha (H.B.No.437), village Chak Ladian (H.B.No. 435), village Dhol Baha (H.B.No. 476), crossing Datarpur (Kamahi Devi) - Haryana road, then again moving towards North along the Western boundaries of village Dhol Baha (H.B.No. 476), village Kukanet (H.B.No.472) and village Dherian (H.B.No.471) up to point 'A' which is the starting point.

The boundaries of Local Planning Area Haryana are specifically shown on the Drawing No. D.T.P. (H) 189 / 2017 Dated 15.09.2017
